Saturday June 17th will see Hatherleigh explode in a mass of brightly coloured corn starch when Hatherleigh Carnival Committee will host the first ever Colour Run in the town. This fun event has its origins in the Hindu festival of Holi to celebrate the arrival of spring, this celebration has been taken and adapted all over the world where brightly coloured powder is thrown in symbolic celebration of good over evil!



To cater for all, we have mapped out both a 5km and 2.5km route around the streets and lanes of Hatherleigh. There is also a 'wheel friendly' route (as friendly as Hatherleigh hills allow!) for those wishing to take part in a wheelchair or pushing a pram. It is definitely NOT a race, more of an experience, and is open to everyone who may like to run, walk or wheel; however they choose to enjoy it best. There is no age limit, but we do ask that all under 11's are supervised by a parent/guardian; under 18's will need a parent/guardian to sign a waiver on their behalf.

We are hoping this event will appeal to old and young, individuals and groups alike, maybe your club, school or group of friends/workmates would like to get dressed up and take part? Entrance costs £12.00 Adult, £8.00 child, please book your place at www.eventbrite.co.uk by June 4th or you can book directly at the visitor centre in Hatherleigh. Participants will receive a white t-shirt to wear, and a medal upon completion - there will also be an opportunity to add other optional extras to wear on the day. Once you've booked your place in the colour run, there's nothing stopping you from collecting sponsorship for a charity or cause of your choice. There will be several colour stations along the route, which are being very kindly sponsored by local businesses – thank you to The Tally Ho!, The Garden Shop, High Field Fest, Miller Town & Country, Katie's Kids Clothes and R Barkwell our sponsors at the time of going to print. Participants will be covered in brightly coloured corn starch as they pass each station. Powder will also be available for spectators to purchase, meaning that even if walking, running or wheeling around is not your thing you can still feel a part of the fun and throw powder at the participants! To ensure the safety of our participants, we must stress that ONLY powder supplied by the committee is thrown. The powder is non-toxic, it will not permanently stain and is non-harmful to animals or fish (if it gets washed into the river), but we do recommend participants wear glasses to protect their eyes. We were very upset to learn that we had collided with the Open Garden weekend and would like to thank the organisers and hosts for agreeing to close an hour earlier on the Saturday, which should mean that garden visitors will escape the coloured powder! The roads will be closed for the duration of the event, and although the powder will not stain, residents and visitors may prefer not to park along the route. To make things easier Mr R Barkwell has very kindly given permission for us to use his field, located along the cricket club lane, as a car park; access to the town car park will still be possible via the Market Quarter. We would like to thank you for your understanding.

Once all entrants have returned to the square there will be an ultimate final burst of colour! The party will continue into the night with food, drink, fun and music provided by Steve Attfield and ThunderLipz in the square. We will also be introducing this year's Carnival President and Royalty. This promises to be a fun event and we look forward to seeing you there!

Hatherleigh Community Primary School

It has been an incredibly busy May and first half of the Summer term. In March the school was inspected by OFSTED and the final written report was published at the beginning of May. We are

very pleased with the outcome with the school being graded Good in all areas of inspection. A big thank you goes to everyone in our school community for all their hard work, dedication and support.

To celebrate the Coronation everyone dressed up in the theme of Coronation and in red, white and blue and enjoyed songs, dancing on the field and lots of Coronation cake. On the Sunday of the Coronation weekend children and staff joined in with the town celebrations including the Floral dance and singing Coronation songs. In the week before the Coronation the Hatherleigh bell ringers came to school to talk about bell ringing, the church bells and Ding for the King, which took place during the Coronation weekend.

Y6 and Y2 children have completed their national tests (SATs), the children worked very hard and displayed a great attitude throughout - well done to all the children and staff. Y2 and Y3 have completed residential visits. Y2 enjoyed a sleep over at school with Forest school activities and Y3 camped on the school field and explored Dartmoor and Northam Burrows as part of their work on rivers. Y2 also visited Okehampton castle, YR Rosemoor and Y4 enjoyed an exciting Samba workshop where they played drums and danced wearing headdresses they had made as part of their work on South America.

The RNLI have visited school to talk to the children about being safe at the beach and we had a visit from Bex Raynor, a member of the team GB football team and Sheffield United player who spoke to the children and ran some fitness activities with them. The County library service has been in school to train some of our Y5 and Y6 children to be librarians showing them how to organise the library and categorise books.

As said, it has been an incredibly busy first half of the Summer term, next half term we have lots more to look forward to including further day trips, the Y6 residential trip to Bristol, Sports day and the PTFA Summer fayre.

As always, I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone in the Hatherleigh school community; children, parents/carers, school staff and the governing board for all of their hard work and support for the school.

A brief note!

I am trying to get a few people together to create a Neighbourhood Plan. You may be wondering "What is a Neighbourhood Plan?". In summary it is a formal document that provides some requirements for development within the parish boundary. As you might expect we don't have 'carte blanche' to make whatever rules we might like - the plan has to be consistent with the West Devon "Local Plan" and national guidelines. More detail can be found here: https:// neighbourhoodplanning.org/ and some examples here: https:// www.westdevon.gov.uk/NeighbourhoodPlans

A few years back Hatherleigh produced a "Community Plan", which served a similar purpose, lead by Clare Tyson. Unfortunately, central government changed some of the requirements, however, there is probably at least 50% of the existing plan that is reusable, and it serves as a good reference document. If you are interested in contributing to the plan, please send a note to hnp.interest@tutanota.com

Ex town planners and any other relevant experience would be especially welcome. Equally useful is representation from the farming community which is an important local industry. The only other qualification is that you live in, or run a business within the parish (or very close to it).

The intention is to create a plan that supports local industry, retains the town character, improves the environment, increases community self-sufficiency / reliance and consumption of locally produced products. In general, to keep Hatherleigh a pleasant place to live and work.

The Night Sky June 2023

June has the shortest nights as we head towards the Summer Solstice on June 21st. This day marks the first day of Summer in the Northern Hemisphere. After this time nights will start to get longer.

On 1st June you'll be able to spot the planet Marsnear a star cluster called the Beehive in the constellation of Cancer, the crad. A pair of binoculars will help with this.

June 4th will see Venus reach its greatest eastern elongation. This means that it will be easy to spot. You can find it shiming brightly in the Western sky shortly after sunset.

Full Moon falls on 4th June.

New Moon falls on 18th June.





Dear Hatherleigh Residents,

You may already be aware, hopefully, you may even be taking part, in Hatherleigh Carnival's debut Colour Run which is set to take place on Saturday June 17th at 4pm. We hope this be a fun event for all ages and abilities to enjoy. We have designed 2.5km and 5km routes around the streets and byways of the town for participants to either walk or run. We also have a wheelchair friendly route, which may also be used for parents wanting to take their small children in prams.



We have applied to temporarily close the following roads on the day between the hours of **3.30pm and 6pm** :- Oakfield Road, Sanctuary Lane, Wingate Lane, Green Lane, Moor Lane, Red Lane, Park Road, Victoria Road, High Street, South Street and Bridge Street. We will of course open them earlier if it is safe to do so.

As part of our route we will also be using the footpath between the Church and Oakfield Road, Honey Farm Lane and Jubilee Footpath.

The event will end up with a party in the square including barbecue, DJ, Bar and live music, so for this reason the road between the **top of Bridge Street (above the Hole Court entrance) and the top of Market Street will be closed from 2pm until 11.59pm.**

Because the Colour Run is based on the Indian Holi Festival, participants will be showered with coloured powder at intervals along the route, also spectators of the event can purchase powder to throw. Please be reassured that this is non-toxic, non-staining environmentally friendly corn-starch that has been dyed using natural food colourings. Please also be reassured this will not cause any contamination to the river and its habitat. Although it can be removed by brushing or easily washed away naturally with the next rainfall, if there is no imminent rain forecast we will have a clean up the following day using collected rainwater.

We have not applied to prevent parking along the route, but due to the nature of the event (lots of coloured powder) you may prefer to remove your car. Mr Rob Barkwell has kindly given us permission to invite residents to use his field along the Cricket Club lane for parking.

We are right in the midst of our asparagus season and although we always have the first cut just steamed with butter and a squeeze of lemon because it's such a delight, here's a recipe that tastes delicious and takes less than 5 minutes to cook.

Asparagus and Chicken Stir Fry

350-500g asparagus cut into small pieces on the diagonal 500g chicken breast or thigh roughly cut into 1" chunks 1 bunch spring onions cut into small pieces on the diagonal 2 tbsp plain flour 1 1/2 tsp turmeric 1 tsp crushed black pepper 1/2 tsp salt 1 tbsp light soy sauce 1 1/2 tbsp honey 1 tbsp of good white / wine / cider vinegar 4 tbsp water Cooked noodles to serve on Squeeze of lemon or lime A little oil for frying Mix honey, vinegar, soy, water and pepper in a cup. Mix Flour, salt and turmeric in a bag or bowl.

Toss chicken in flour mix to coat then fry it on a high heat until golden. Add asparagus and spring onion for 1-2 mins.. Pour on sauce little by little, stirring so it cooks off and doesn't just boil. Serve on cooked noodles with a squeeze of lemon or lime and salt and pepper to taste.
